For nearly 30 years, Safranek has served Westside Community Schools in a variety of roles: speech-language pathologist, reading teacher, curriculum leader, and mentor. Regardless of her title, she has demonstrated a fierce commitment to students, especially those who need her the most.

Safranek arrives at school every day with purpose, humility, and heart, quietly changing lives without ever seeking recognition. Colleagues describe Safranek as both deeply knowledgeable and endlessly curious, often ahead of educational trends and creating space for collaboration and growth.

Safranek is known for giving up her own time to work one-on-one with struggling readers, meeting students during lunch breaks or planning periods. But her influence extends far beyond individual interventions. She mentors fellow educators and is passionate about shaping reading instruction across the district.

This year, Safranek stepped into a new role at Westbrook Elementary, and by sharing her warmth, wisdom, and leadership, she has quickly become a cornerstone. Staff say she has transformed the school's reading program and inspired others to grow in their own practice.
