





Special Services in Westside Community Schools



The mission of the Special Services Department is to provide quality educational opportunities to students with disabilities ranging in age from birth through age 21. In order to fulfill that mission, the goal is to educate all students in their neighborhood school to the greatest extent possible, regardless of their disabilities. This is made possible by offering a continuum of services designed to meet individual student needs. These services range from a consultative model to highly specialized alternative program options. Westside educates roughly 1,000 special education-identified students and employs approximately 120 certified staff members. Westside special educators are proud to be statewide leaders in the delivery of individualized, innovative, and inclusive special education services.



We Are Westside... Fiscally Responsible

FY20 Budget: \$75,460,000

Where Does the Money Go?



• 2019/20 enrollment: 5,995 K-12 students, the highest in four years. Approximately 34% of our students live in other districts and choose to attend Westside through option enrollment, adding approximately \$20,270,000 in revenue to our district, allowing us to maintain 10 neighborhood elementary schools, 1:1 technology, modular scheduling and to provide robust programs and course offerings.

Revenue vs. Expenses



- We reduced our General Fund levy by 1 penny, to \$1.1924
- The Total levy (General Fund/Bond/Bldg) then decreased by \$0.002514 or 0.18%, to \$1.3824
- Based on a \$250,000 home, the annual tax payment would be \$3,456, which is a decrease of \$6.28 from the prior year

We Are Westside... Building for the Future

We are currently working on our final project as part of Phase 1 in Westside's 2015 Facilities Master Plan. To date, all projects have been completed **on time and on budget.**

Oakdale Elementary, 9801 West Center Road

- Opened to students in January 2018
- 54,600 square feet
- \$14,504,000
- KEY FEATURES: Improved safety and security, dedicated art and music space, historical elements from 1871 school (architectural design and original school bell)



Prairie Lane Elementary *Under Construction* 11444 Hascall Street

- Opening to students in 2021
- 41,000 square feet renovated and added for a total of 54,600 square feet
- \$10,750,000
- KEY FEATURES: Improved safety and security, improved drop-off/pick-up, improved utilities, separate gym and cafeteria



Sunset Hills Elementary, 9503 Walnut Street

- Opened to students in August 2018
- 54,600 square feet
- \$13.824.000
- KEY FEATURES: Expanded to become a 2-section school, improved safety and security, separate gym and cafeteria, new project-based learning areas



Swanson Elementary, 410 S. 86th Street

- Opened to students in August 2019
- 54,600 square feet
- \$13,904,000
- KEY FEATURES: Additional classroom space to replace portables, a dedicated outdoor education or science room with access to Arboretum, separate gym and cafeteria, improved safety and security including storm shelters



Hawkins Family Westside Boys & Girls Club at Westbrook 1414 Robertson Drive

- Opened to students in August 2019
- 15,000 square feet of dedicated club space
- Project financed by Boys & Girls Clubs of the Midlands
- KEY FEATURES: Safety and security improvements, drone obstacle course, learning space available for Westbrook elementary students



Westside Middle School, 8601 Arbor Street

- Renovation complete: January 2017
- 75,600 square feet renovated for 183,000 total square feet
- \$16,765,000
- KEY FEATURES: Utility and structural repairs throughout, science lab improvements, additional learning space to replace portables, improved special education areas
